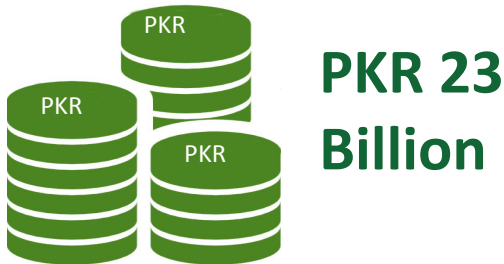


## How we work:

PHF members support the people of Pakistan in partnership with the communities that they serve. They work within the framework and the priorities set by the Government of Pakistan. PHF members are continuously increasing efforts to ensure accountability of public funds and transparency to the people they work with, as well as to donors and the host Government.

### Programming Budgets:



Collective amount raised by International Non Governmental Organisations (INGOs) and used to support humanitarian assistance and social services in Pakistan in 2015, this is in addition to the Government expenditure for the humanitarian and development sector.

### Working in Partnership:



INGOs are key partners of the Government of Pakistan national civil society, private sector, UN Agencies and donors. In 2015 PHF member INGOs worked with over 375 partners in their project implementation across Pakistan.

### Employment in the Social Sector:



Pakistanis are employed by PHF member INGOs.

### Building International Humanitarian and Development Capacity:

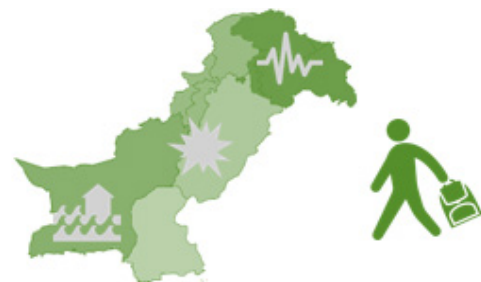


Pakistani national staff of PHF members are highly trained and qualified for work in relief and development. They use this expertise in regular short-term deployments world-wide.

### Immediate, Experienced Emergency Response Capacity:



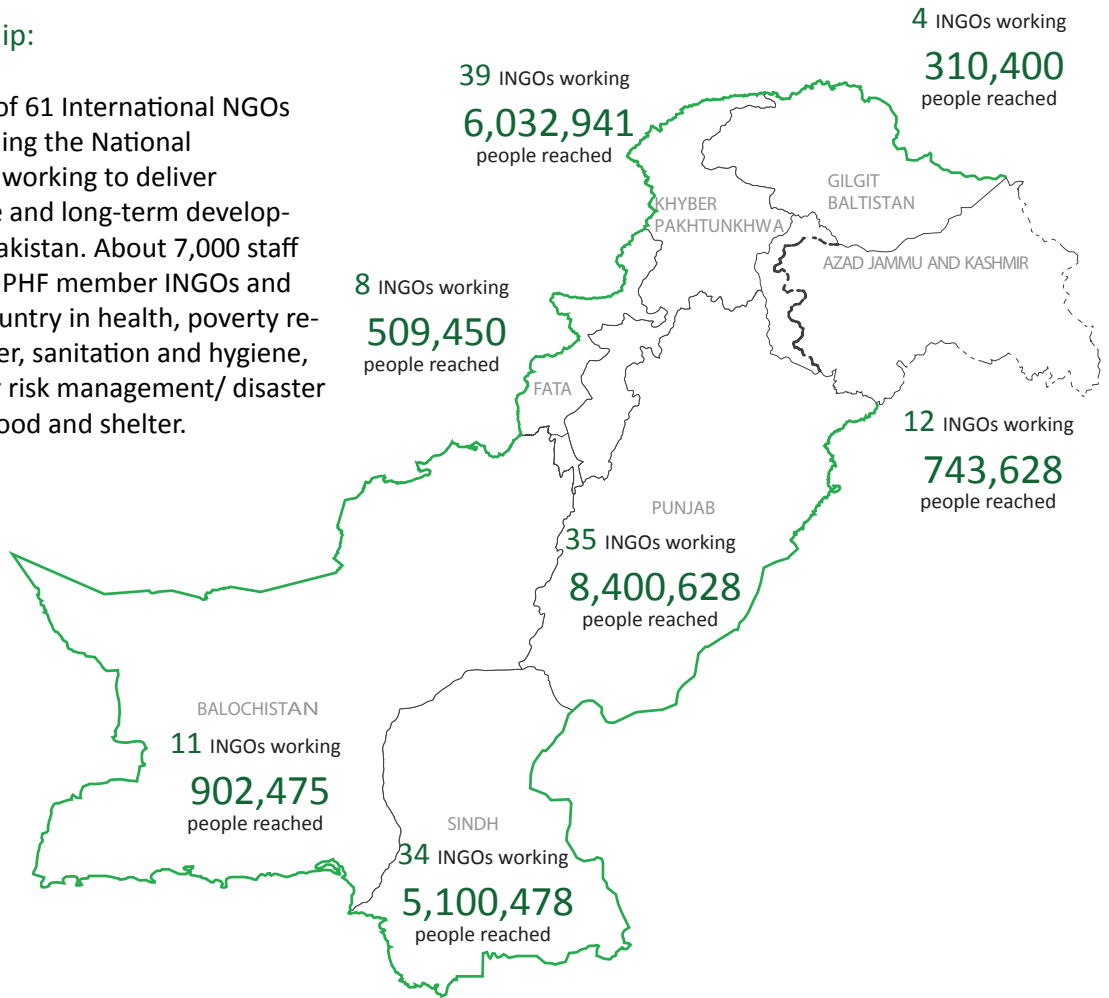
International workers make up 0.6 percent of total employees.

**About PHF Membership:**

PHF has a membership of 61 International NGOs and 11 Observers including the National Humanitarian Network, working to deliver humanitarian assistance and long-term development programming in Pakistan. About 7,000 staff are employed locally by PHF member INGOs and work throughout the country in health, poverty reduction, education, water, sanitation and hygiene, climate change, disaster risk management/ disaster reduction, agriculture, food and shelter.

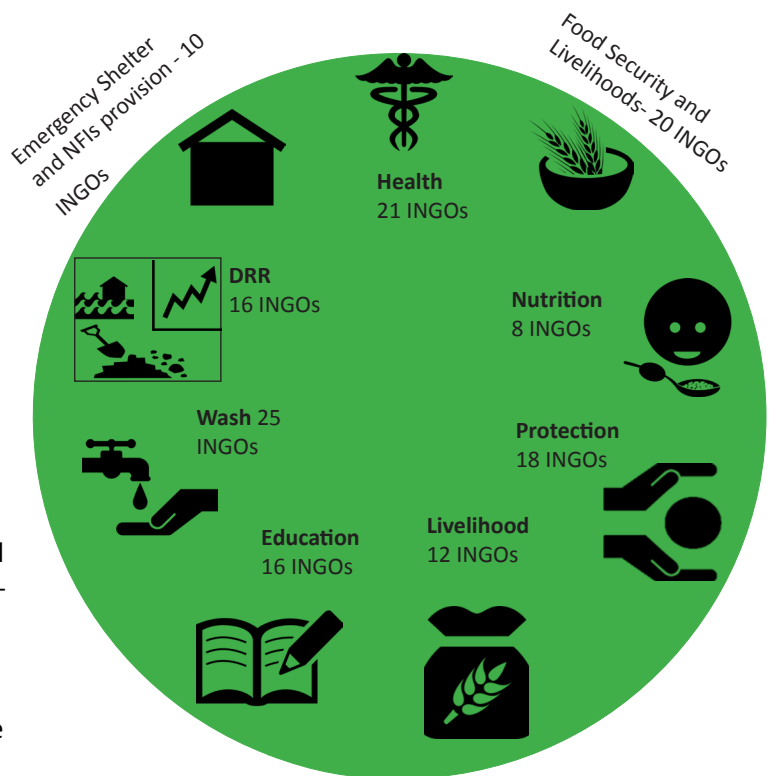


**People Reached:**
