

About PHF membership:

Pakistan Humanitarian Forum (PHF) is a representative body of 62 International non-governmental organisations (INGOs) and 11 Observers, including the National Humanitarian Network (NHN), working to deliver humanitarian assistance and long-term development programming in Pakistan. About 5,000 staff are employed locally by PHF member INGOs and work throughout the country in health, poverty reduction, education, water, sanitation and hygiene, climate change and agriculture.

INGOs district presence in Sindh:

31 PHF member INGOs are currently working in Sindh.



Over **8** Million people will be reached in 2016 in Sindh with humanitarian relief and development assistance by INGOs.

Working in partnership:



INGOs are key partners of the Government of Pakistan national civil society, private sector, UN Agencies and donors. PHF members are currently implementing their projects in partnership with 150 partners across Pakistan.

What we do:

- Provide training to Government staff on nutrition sensitive interventions.
- Operate outpatient therapeutic programmes (OTP) to treat children with malnutrition.
- Support the Department of Health Sindh with human resource, which includes medical officers and para-medical staff, essential medicine and medical supplies and equipment.
- Distribute solar stills to communities.
- Develop sustainable livelihoods for rural women through business and technical skills.
- Provide interest free loans to communities to enhance their access to income generation opportunities.
- Provision of clean drinking water through installation of water wells and hand pumps.
- Develop district disaster risk management plans with local authorities.

How we work:

PHF members support the people of Pakistan in partnership with the communities that they serve. They work within the framework and the priorities set by the Government of Pakistan. PHF members are continuously increasing efforts to ensure accountability of public funds and transparency to the people they work with, as well as to donors and the host Government.

Programming budgets:



Collective amount raised by PHF members in 2016, this is in addition to the Government expenditure for humanitarian and development sectors.

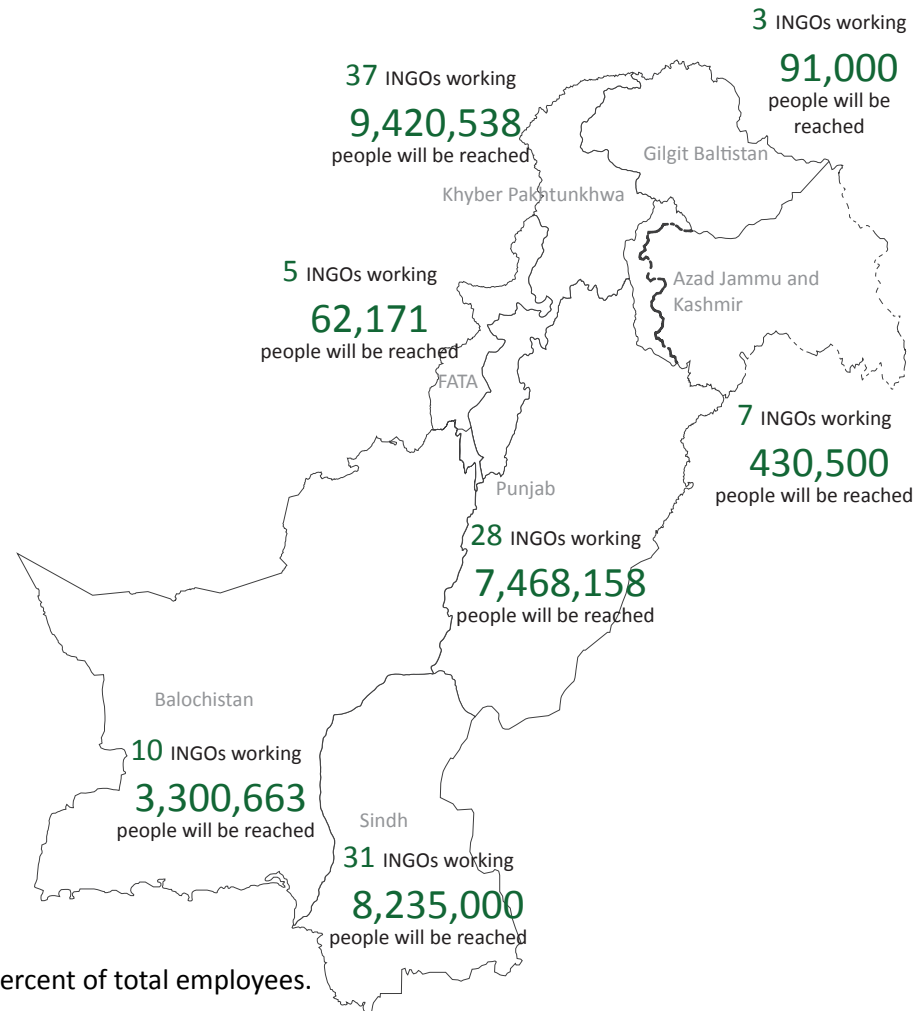
Employment in the social sector:
