The World Health Organisation (WHO) recommended at least a 1-metre distance to prevent the spread of COVID-19. It also recommended to maintain a greater distance when indoors.

AstraZeneca’s COVID-19 vaccine is not perfect, but will have a big impact on the pandemic, its chief executive has predicted, as the drug-maker pledged to double supplies to more than 200 million doses per month by April 2021. Meanwhile, AstraZeneca has said it’s working with the University of Oxford to adapt its COVID-19 vaccine to protect against new strains of the virus as public health officials raise concerns about mutations that may make the virus more resistant to existing vaccines.

Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Director said the African Union’s disease control body has said that it is not “walking away” from AstraZeneca’s COVID-19 vaccine, after trial data showed it had greatly reduced efficacy against the Coronavirus variant dominant in South Africa.

National Updates

- Pakistan is to allow private companies to import coronavirus vaccines and has agreed to exempt such imports from price caps. The National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination division had sought a special cabinet exemption to allow for such imports, while excluding the imported vaccines from the strict price cap regime that is typically applied to all drug sales within the country.
- Pakistan has made it mandatory for the Sikh pilgrims from India to take a COVID-19 test before travelling to Gurdwara Nankana Sahib
- Pakistan has vaccinated about 27,000 frontline healthcare workers against the Coronavirus during its ongoing anti-COVID-19 vaccination drive. Among the health workers vaccinated include 21,121 in Sindh, 4,458 in Punjab, 691 in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, 274 in Islamabad, 239 in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), 312 in Gilgit-Baltistan and 133 in Balochistan.
- Frontline health workers in Pakistan who have received the first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine have urged their colleagues to not be hesitant in getting the shot, saying there are no side effects. A video released by the government on its vaccination strategy showed brief interviews of health workers from different health facilities across Pakistan in which they spoke about the positives of getting China's Sinopharm vaccine.
- The NCOC said the rate of positivity of COVID-19 infections has reached 4.02% in Pakistan with a total of 30,225 active cases, of which 1,760 patients are in critical condition.
- The highest positivity rate has been reported in Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJ&K) at 9.39%, followed by Sindh at 4.88%, Punjab at 4.75%, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa at 2.63%, Islamabad at 1.92%, Balochistan at 1.48%, and Gilgit-Baltistan at 0.83%.




PHF Members Response



Cash Grants

- Helping Hand for Relief and Development (HHRD) gave out cash grants of 8,000 PKR to 9,600 beneficiaries across several districts of Pakistan.



Safeguarding

- Helpage International reached out to 1 million beneficiaries via protection of rights of older people and its advocacy and awareness campaign for COVID-19 in KP and Sindh.
- International Catholic Migration Commission (ICMC) provided awareness on COVID-19 and protection activities in Islamabad and Punjab's Attock, Chakwal, Mianwali and Rawalpindi. The beneficiaries of these activities were refugees holding POR cards.



WASH

- Norwegian Church Aid donated hygiene kits, conducted awareness raising, provided PPEs, handwashing stations and disinfection at different locations across Sindh and KP.
- Oxfam Pakistan has distributed 60,700 soaps nationwide. 4,400 hygiene kits have been provided to 13 organizations across the country. Oxfam supported local partners across 12 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa by providing soap bars to 50 hand-washing stations.
