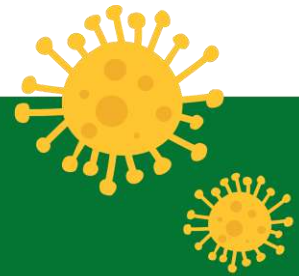

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has given the go-ahead for emergency use of Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine. The mRNA vaccine from the US manufacturer joins vaccines from AstraZeneca, Pfizer-BioNTech and Johnson & Johnson in receiving the WHO's emergency use listing.

Russia is turning to multiple Chinese firms to manufacture the Sputnik V Coronavirus vaccine in an effort to speed up production, which could mean quicker access for countries in Latin America, the Middle East and Africa.

Pfizer is in discussions with the Indian government seeking an "expedited approval pathway" for its COVID-19 vaccine, announcing a donation of medicines worth more than 70 million USD.

National Updates

- The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) is set to provide Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) worth over 14 million USD to Pakistan to help contain the spread of COVID-19 pandemic in the country.
- Special Assistant to the Prime Minister (SAPM) on Health Dr. Faisal Sultan has said that so far the Government has signed deals for procuring 30 million Coronavirus vaccine doses, adding that 19 million doses will be received by June. He added that the Government is not relying on donations and 90% of the doses were being purchased. He said that 70 million people will be vaccinated against COVID-19 in the country by the end of 2021.
- The National Institute of Health (NIH) in Islamabad detected the Brazilian and South African variants of the Coronavirus in one sample each through genome sequencing. The authorities are now actively engaged in tracing the positive cases.
- Pakistan not only decreased the number of inbound flights to 20% as part of measures to halt the spread of COVID-19 from May 5 to May 20, but also also reduced the number of foreign airlines' flights to 120 per week.
- The Civil Aviation Authority has extended ban on travel to Pakistan from countries in its Category C list. The restrictions include fining airlines that allow passengers to board without PCR test result; and requiring passengers to provide their information through Pass Track app.
- Pakistan will close the land border terminals for the entry of pedestrians from Afghanistan and Iran for over two weeks from May 5 in efforts to stop the spread of COVID-19.
- National Command and Operation Center (NCOC) said the national rate of positivity of COVID-19 infections has reached 9.17% in Pakistan with a total of 87,953 active cases, of which there are 5,377 patients in critical condition.
- Overall COVID-19 positivity was highest in Balochistan 16.50%, followed by Punjab at 12.51%, Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJK) at 11.82%, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa at 10.10%, Islamabad at 8.31%, Sindh 5.40%, and Gilgit Baltistan at 3.90%.

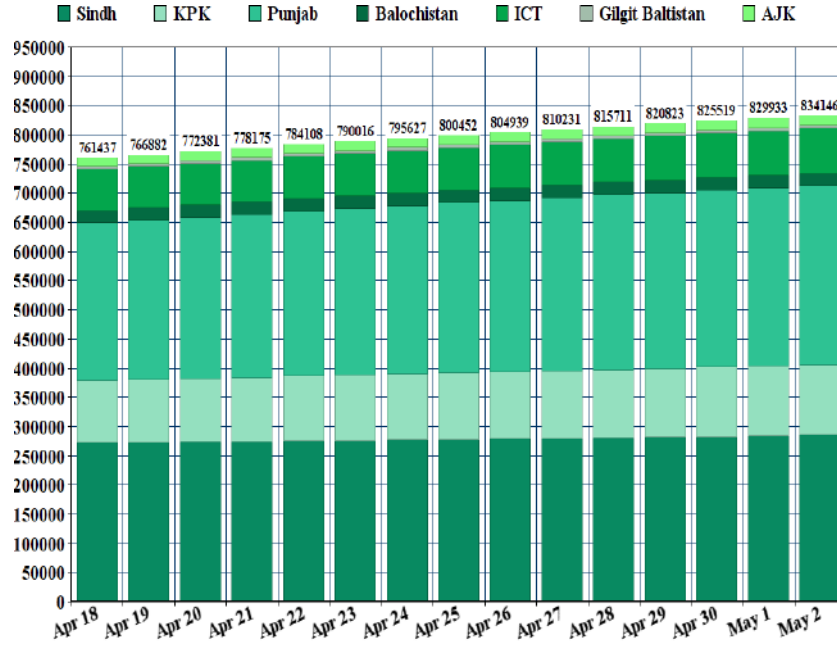
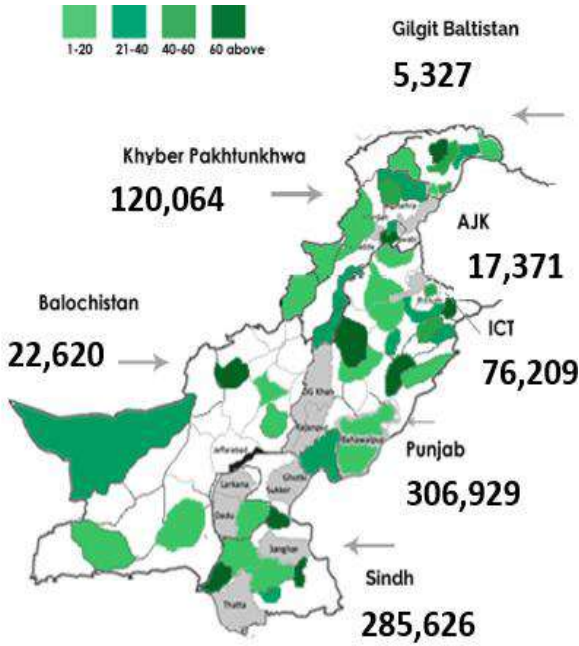

PHF Members Response



- Oxfam distributed ration bags to 6,100 households in Punjab and 3,250 households in Sindh.
- Secours Islamique France (SIF) responded through distribution of food bags and NFI reaching out to around 6,696 people in KP, Sindh and Federal capital.



- Medecins du Monde - France (MDM) is implementing BEmONC services in KP and is currently running 3 in the remote areas of Hangu and D.I. Khan in partnership with the KP Department of Health.



- Cesvi installed 27 paddle-operated handwashing stations in several hospitals of Swat, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.
- Norwegian Church Aid (NCA) distributed 3,667 hygiene kits in the targeted areas among the most vulnerable families.
