SUCCESS STORIES HOPE 87 Hundreds of Original Projects for Employment

Giving a hope for a brighter future

Nabi Gul, an Afghan refugee father of 5 children (3 boys and 2 girls) was injured in a bomb blast in Peshawar in 2006. With poor and limited access to treatments Nabi's health deteriorated to the extent that he is unable to work now. Two of his boys aged 15 and 6 started working to support the family. Ahmed the 6 years old boy started multiple jobs, working as a street vendor selling food snacks and helping in a tailor's shop. "I love going to school and getting education, but my dad is unwell, and he is not able to pay my school fee.", said Ahmed.

Ahmed was enrolled in a low-cost private school through an education voucher scheme of HOPE'87. He is one of the 1,775 Afghan out of school children (850 girls) benefitting from the "Education Voucher scheme" in district Peshawar with the support of European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (ECHO) and Austrian Development Cooperation (ADC). The education voucher is redeemable at low-cost partner private schools of HOPE'87 and cover school fees and basic educational supplies like bag, books, uniform, shoes. Ahmed continues to support his family, working after school hours. "When I grow up and become successful, *I'll help the needy people"*, says the hopeful and ambitious Ahmed.



"I love going to school and getting education but my dad is a heart patient and he was not able to pay my school fee so I had to leave the school. But now HOPE'87 admitted me in Sana Model School. When I grow up and become successful, I'll help the needy people".

The Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) warned on Tuesday that the country is expected to receive "above average rainfall" during the upcoming monsoon season this year. In a statement, the Met Office said that monsoon season is expected to begin during the last week of this month (June) while pre-monsoon rains are likely to start in the second week of June. *Read more*

The Met Office has forecast likely dust and thunderstorm with rainfall in some districts of Sindh on Sunday evening. Regional Meteorological Centre Karachi has predicted dust-thunderstorm and likely rainfall at isolated places in Dadu, Jacobabad, Qambar-Shahdadkot, Larkana and Sukkur districts of the province. Some parts of Karachi last night received drizzle while weather in interior of Sindh remained cloudy. *Read more*

The government has allocated around Rs2100 million for Information and Broadcasting Division in the Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP) for the year 2022-2023 for five ongoing and 12 new projects. According to the budgetary document released here on Friday, the government has specified Rs1588.335 million for the new projects and Rs511 million for ongoing projects of the Information and Broadcasting Division. Amid the rising cases of monkeypox, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has revealed that it can spread through the air but only through 'sustained' face-to-face contact with an infected person. PAKISTAN REPORTS FOURTH WILD POLIO CASE

In the fourth case this year, a 13-month-old boy has been paralyzed by wild poliovirus in North Waziristan, Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa. The child had an onset of paralysis on 5 May in Mir Ali. The case was confirmed by the Pakistan National Polio Laboratory at the National Institute of Health, Islamabad on Monday, 23 May. This is the third case from Mir Ali this year.

"Another child in North Waziristan has been paralyzed by wild poliovirus. This 13-month-old child will live with disabilities for the rest of his life because of a virus that is entirely preventable. This is a collective loss for Pakistan," said Federal Health Minister Abdul Qadir Patel. <u>Read more</u>

Pakistan Meteorological Department: Weekly Drought Information (7 June 2022) [EN/UR]

During last week, light rainfall was received at Tandojam in Sindh province, while no rainfall event was recorded in Balochistan . Most areas in both the provinces remained hot and dry while an increasing trend is prevailing in day-time temperatures at various places in Sindh. Duration of forecast: 07 to 13 June, 2022. During next week, no significant rainfall is expected in both Balochistan and Sindh.
