Drop by Drop: Water Changes Lives



The village Makol, UC Haji Pur, Tehsil Rojhan, District Rajanpur, Punjab Pakistan, is an underdeveloped and markedly poor area. The socio-economic development indicators over there are highly unsatisfactory. Most of the population is living below the poverty line and does not have access to education, health, and safe and clean drinking water services. Poor infrastructure, lack of health facilities, unpaved roads, and lack of education have kept the area deprived of its basic rights. Open drainage and defecation & poor sanitation facilities have multiplied the cases of diarrhea, water-borne diseases, and environmental pollution. The cases of hepatitis are high due to the substantial consumption of contaminated water. Sadaqat Hussain, a resident from the community was reported saying:

"We are living a miserable life where we are not sure that we will get the next meal or not. I want our children to get an education and the best health facilities but unfortunately, every day there is a new struggle and challenge to beat".

He appealed to people to come forward and help them for the provision of clean water for their community. Upon conducting a thorough needs assessment, Muslim Hands designed and launched a communal well project in December 2020 in the targeted area with a special focus to provide community access to safe and clean drinking water as the residents of this area do not have direct access to safe & clean drinking water. Before the intervention of Muslim Hands, the natives of the area felt helpless and had to travel to distant areas to fetch water.

The project has relieved them from the burden of fetching water from far-flung areas. They now feel very blessed to have a water supply scheme in their area. After the installation of the communal well, Sadaqat Hussain also expressed his heartfelt gratitude and thankfulness to the Muslim Hands team and its donors:

"I cannot express my feeling in words. I pray for donor and MH from my heart who are supporting poor and needy people like us. I was not able to provide this necessity to my family. But with the help of Muslim Hands, we got this intervention so effortlessly without spending any penny."

Yet they continue to face exclusion, marginalization, and threats. 

How you will learn

Learners in previous cohorts rated the course 4.8 out of 5. The course takes approximately 21 hours to finish. To successfully pass the course, learners must answer 70% of the questions in 12 short quizzes correctly. The course primarily consists of videos, readings, quizzes and offers the opportunity to engage in optional discussions every week.

The United Kingdom has announced a bilateral programme worth up to 130 million pounds to support girls' education in Pakistan that will impact nearly 17 million children. The programme, titled "Girls and Out of School: Action for Learning (GOAL)", will support the governments of Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa to improve outcomes for girls and the most marginalised. At least 541 coronavirus cases were reported over the last 24 hours, the highest tally in the past three months, the National Institute of Health said. Though the Covid trend was increasing, the death toll was still low as one expiry of the patient was reported. "Total tests in last 24 hours: 15,462; positive cases: 541; positivity %: 3.50%; deaths: 01; patients on critical care: 100," *Read more*

Monkeypox is not yet a global health emergency, the World Health Organisation (WHO) has ruled, although WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said he was deeply concerned about the outbreak. WHO said in a separate statement that although there were some differing views within the committee, they ultimately agreed by consensus that at this stage the outbreak is not a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC). Cargo planes from Pakistan and Qatar carrying relief material for Afghan earthquake survivors have landed at the Khost airport, officials said on Saturday, as rescuers struggle to deliver aid to remote regions in the wake of Wednesday devastating earthquake. Thousands have been left homeless or injured by the magnitude 5.9 earthquake in Paktika and Khost provinces, which state media said killed 1,150 people. Read more


Afghanistan Situation Refugee Response Dashboard First Quarter (


