

Climate Emergency in Pakistan-Flood 2022

As according to the reports of NDMA, WFP and UNOCHA

Overview of Situation

More than 5.1 million women are of reproductive age, including an estimated 410,846 pregnant women. Approximately 136,950 births are expected in the next three months. As of 11 November, humanitarian partners have reached 7.9 million people with life-saving assistance in flood-affected areas. Vector-borne and water-borne diseases remain a major concern in flood-affected areas. Around 1,000 confirmed cholera cases and 64,767 dengue fever cases, with 147 deaths, have been reported.

In the flood-impacted areas, many households rely on agriculture and livestock production for their livelihoods, and damage to these sectors will have a major impact on food security and the agriculture sector in the coming months. According to information from the field, farmers reported debt of around PKR 100,000-150,000 on average due to damages to their crops.

- The revised UN flood appeal was launched, with UNICEF requirements totalling US\$173.5 million for 2022 and 2023, to provide life-saving responses to the most vulnerable people affected by floods, including children. Under the nutrition programme, a total of 30,602 severely wasted children (12,436 new) have been enrolled for treatment.
- UNICEF has reached 815,589 people (352,612 new) with access to safe drinking water. Through UNICEF health programme, 712,674 people (201,683 new) benefitted from outreach camps services by 78 mobile health teams. 100,214 (49,399 new) children were immunized against measles.

UNICEF education programme has established 624 Temporary Learning Centers in Balochistan, Punjab and Sindh, supporting 51,053 students (21,700 girls). The humanitarian situation in Pakistan has deteriorated over the past months due to unprecedented flooding, impacting an already highly vulnerable population. Compounded by the political volatility, economic deterioration, the residual impact of COVID-19 and the protracted nutrition emergency, with high rates of global acute malnutrition (on average 23 per cent in the districts most affected by floods), children have been pushed to the brink. During the monsoosn season, rainfall was equivalent to nearly 2.9 times the national 30-year average, causing widespread flooding and landslides with severe repercussions for human lives, property, and infrastructure. An estimated 20.6 million people, including 9.6 million children, need humanitarian assistance. To date, 90 districts have been declared 'calamity hit' by the Government of Pakistan. Many of the hardest-hit districts are amongst the most vulnerable districts in Pakistan, where children already suffer from high malnutrition, poor access to water and sanitation, low school enrolment, and other deprivations.

The UN launched the revised Pakistan Floods Response Plan, supported by the findings of the Multi-Sector Rapid Needs Assessment, adjusted targets and budgets to better align with overall needs (September 2022). The Government of Pakistan has established a National Flood Response and Coordination Centre to support a coordinated approach to providing flood relief and response.

- akistan welcomed an agreement Sunday at the United Nations climate conference in Egypt that would establish a fund to help developing countries ravaged by the impacts of global warming. The South Asian nation of about 225 million people experienced catastrophic floods between June and August of this year, triggered by climate change-induced torrential rains. The flooding drenched one-third of Pakistan's territory, affected 33 million people and killed more than 1,700 others. It cost the country an estimated \$40 billion in damages and economic losses. *Read More*
- Dr. Altaf Ali Siyal, water expert and Dean of Faculty of Agricultural Engineering of Sindh Agriculture University has said that the Agriculture sector of Sindh Province is facing various threats and concerns due to climate change, after the adverse effects of floods, experts will have to change the land restoration, water, environment, and cultivation practices through their research. - Pakistan's Minister for Planning, Development and Special Initiatives Mr. Ahsan Igbal on Thursday said that promoting green investment in Pakistan was a top priority of the government to tackle the growing environmental issues. This came during the panel discussion at the launching of "Friends of Greening National Investment Plans in Africa and Developing Countries Initiative" on "Solutions Day" hosted by Minister for Planning and Economic Development Egypt Hala El-Said on the margins of COP27 Climate Conference in Sharm El-Sheikh. Chairman UK-Pakistan Joint Business Council Mian Kashif Ashfaq Sunday said the United Kingdom has announced seven innovative low-carbon projects as a part of the first cohort for the climate finance accelerator(CFA), Pakistan. He said these projects have the potential to benefit communities across Pakistan through pollution abatement, employment opportunities, access to energy, effective waste management e-mobility, and by supporting gender equality and social inclusive efforts. *Read More*

The UN General Assembly's Third Committee has adopted four resolutions submitted by Pakistan, on behalf of Group of 77 (developing countries) and including texts addressing xenophobia and related intolerance, social development, International Year of the Family as well as aging. Three of the four drafts, introduced by Ambassador Aamir Khan, deputy permanent representative of Pakistan to the UN, were approved *Read More*

The National Institute of Health (NIH) on Sunday said that 7,561 corona tests have been conducted across the country during the last 24 hours. According to the data released by NIH, 7561 corona tests were conducted during the last 24 hours, Out of which 29 people have tested positive for Corona. Thus, the rate of positive corona test conducted in the last 24 hours has been 0.38 percent. Moreover, no patient has died due to corona virus during this period, while the condition of 42 patients is critical. *Read More*

As many as 130 more people are affected by the dengue virus in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and now the number of people affected by the virus in the province has surged to 21,870, an official of the Health Department told the media, here, on Saturday. The maximum number of cases reported in Peshawar is 58 with total cases increasing to 9,218, the official disclosed. He said 13 dengue cases were reported in Mardan with the total number of cases surging to 4,015. Moreover, 18 new cases were reported in Lower Dir; 17 in Bannu, and 16 in Swabi, he informed. *Read More*

Stepping up for women and girls during the flood crisis in Pakistan

To ensure that women and girls receive the support they need in times of crisis, says Fouzia Yasmin, Senior Manager at Pakistani mental health organization Rozan, "relief support programmes need to be designed to address the vulnerabilities of women and girls during disasters". Catastrophic flooding in Pakistan that began in mid-2022 has killed over 1,500 people, displaced nearly 8 million,and left countless more in areas still submerged and lacking shelter, food, clean water and medicine. Amid the disaster, women and girls are facing additional risks to their safety. Funded by the UN Trust Fund to End Violence against Women (UN Trust Fund), Rozan runs a project in the Hyderabad and Sukkur districts of Pakistan to improve institutional support for women survivors of domestic violence when they leave temporary safe shelters. *Read more*

International Education Week, November 2022

RI is supporting the education services delivery through school's rehabilitation, teachers and education official training, schools supply, capacitating and functioning the existing Parent Teacher's Councils through extensive training packages. RI is regularly assessing and documenting key barriers to education for refugee children. RI is establishing ALP centers for children who have missed out on school and desperately require a second chance at education to provide a better future. The primary-ALP program requires 30-32 months to complete primary education and student will be able to catch-up with elementary education later on. Relief International is engaging fully on-board members of Parent Teachers Councils (PTCs), Afghan Community Forums (ACF), parents and caregivers for all this program. *Read more*

Pakistan: Fortnightly drought watch bulletin (1-15 November 2022)

During the last week, light rainfall was reported from both Sindh and Balochistan. Night-time temperatures are decreasing more as compared to the Day-time temperatures indifferent cities. The change occurred in the Drought situation during last week with respect to the previous week is updated using Standardized Precipitation Index (SPI). The change is shown in map form which is appended below. Currently normal conditions are prevailing in most of the districts in Balochistan and Sindh but coastal and its adjoining areas are showing wetter conditions compared to the previous week. According to meteorological conditions, in the next week no specific rain is expected in both Balochistan and Sindh provinces. While cold weather is expected in north Balochistan. Drought like situation has been terminated from Sindh and Balochistan due to previous rains. Read more
