Shabnam Baloch Meeting with NDMA. "Climate financing for WASH brief – Pakistan scoping brief" undertaken by IRC researchers led by Habib-ur-Rehman here at a ceremony jointly organised by the IRC and the Sustainable Development Policy Institute (SDPI). The study calls upon international donors to allocate at least 35% of climate-related budget for WASH raising it from the existing 22% for Pakistan and prioritise allocation of WASH and climate-related funding to the countries which are currently unlikely to achieve the WASH SDGs.





Islamic Relief Pakistan: While visiting flood-affected areas, First Secretary @lottaericsdotter @swedeninpakistan $s\epsilon$ shared her thoughts on the damages & needs that could take years to rebuild. Read More

Relief International introduces an Accelerated Learning Program (ALP) for left-behind children aged 10-14 who have never been to school or never completed their primary education. 40 centers are established with 40 trained facilitators in the province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa for 1600 Afghan Children, furthermore, they will be provided with school kits & ALP student packages. The project objective is to 'Improve equitable access to safe, quality formal and non-formal education for Afghan and host community children to increase empowerment, dignity, and life opportunities in Pakistan'.





Buzz of the Week



Chairman NDMA, Lieutenant General Inam Haider Malik presided the special session of National Emergency Operation Centre (NEOC) today. National Institute of Health (NIH) team was called on for updated monitoring of regional trends of new variant of coronavirus and trajectories development for Pakistan without creating undue alarm. Having spent about \$1.5 billion equivalent from its resources so far on flood rehabilitation, Pakistan would be seeking concessional loans from international development partners during the upcoming 'donor conference' in Geneva to build a resilient future with over \$16bn worth of recovery, rehabilitation and reconstruction activities. Secretary Ministry for Planning, Development and Special Initiatives Syed Zafar Ali Shah said that the reconstruction and rehabilitation was an ongoing process and besides the about \$1.5bn worth of expenditure so far, *Read More*

As many as 149 people have so far been killed in the country due to dengue fever in 2022, of which the highest number of deaths, 62, were reported in Sindh, officials said on Tuesday. "Around 78,554 confirmed dengue cases have been reported from entire Pakistan till December 27, 2022, while 149 people died due to complications of dengue in the country", an official of the National Institute of Health (NIH) Islamabad said. The official said 62 people died due to complications of dengue in Sindh, 50 people died in Punjab, Read More

Months after devastating floods in Pakistan, millions remain homeless and need shelter, an aid volunteer says. Up to 33 million people were affected earlier this year amid widespread devastation in monsoon season. A UN report said about eight million are still potentially exposed to floods or live close to affected areas. Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has urged the international community to provide "urgent assistance". Read More

JICA extends its support to the Flood Affected Districts of Punjab and KP

Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Pakistan Office extends its support to the flood affected districts of Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Provinces by providing in total 9000 mosquito nets, 80,000 ORS and 400,000 water purification tablets. On the request of Government of Punjab and KP, the Government of Japan and JICA Pakistan Office decided to extend its support to the worst affected districts of both the provinces. *Read More*

UNDP Pakistan: Flood Recovery Programme (FRP)

The devastating floods of 2022 have extracted a heavy toll from Pakistan especially on the poor and vulnerable segments of the society. In addition to causing more than 1,700 deaths and affecting around 33 million people, the floods have caused damages and losses to the national economy to the tune of over US\$ 30 billion and would need a sum of US\$ 16 billion to ensure resilient recovery. *Read More*

Around 5.4 million people remain displaced as per the latest available data. In some locations of Sindh province, and in parts of Balochistan, water has yet to recede and may remain for several months into the new year, protracting the dire humanitarian situation for people in these areas.

The World Bank's Board of Executive Directors today approved \$1.692 billion in financing for five projects to support people living in flood-affected areas of Sindh Province in Pakistan.
