SNAPSHOT | 2022

In 2022, Pakistan faced a devastating flood disaster that highlighted the country's vulnerability to climate change. Despite Pakistan's minimal contribution to global greenhouse gas emissions, the floods caused widespread destruction, surpassing even the 2010 floods. The poorest households and regions with limited human development resources were most severely affected. Approximately 33 million people were directly impacted, and 8 million were displaced. The estimated damage, loss, and recovery needs amounted to significant economic burdens, particularly in the housing, agriculture, and transport sectors. The provinces of Sindh, Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and Punjab emerged as areas requiring substantial recovery and reconstruction assistance. 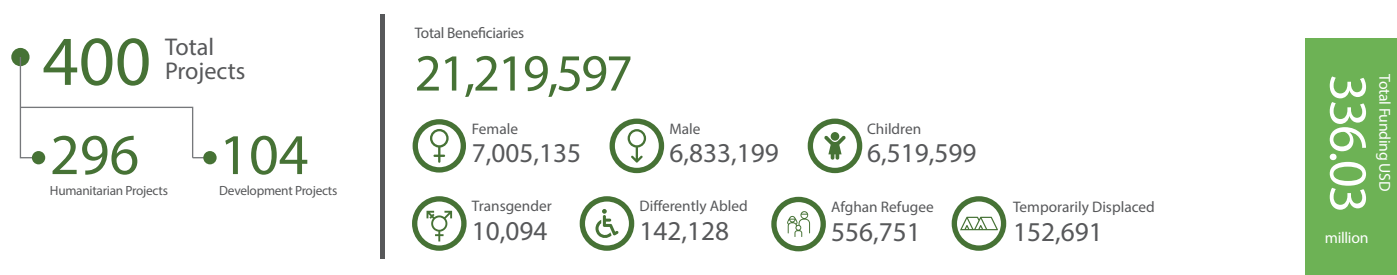




SNAPSHOT | 2022

In 2022, PHF member organizations (INGOs) implemented 400 projects throughout Pakistan including AJ&K and Gilgit Baltistan. These projects included 296 dedicated to providing humanitarian assistance, particularly in response to 2022 floods, and 104 focused on development interventions. These initiatives, worth over \$330 million, benefited more than 21.2 million people across the country. PHF emphasizes the importance of long-term recovery and reconstruction in flood-affected areas, extending its commitment beyond immediate response efforts. PHF's annual report expresses gratitude to the Government of Pakistan for its support and highlights the forum's unwavering commitment to improving the lives of marginalized and vulnerable communities. It emphasizes the need to strengthen partnerships with government institutions, UN agencies, humanitarian actors, civil society organizations, and other stakeholders to foster a cohesive and effective humanitarian response.

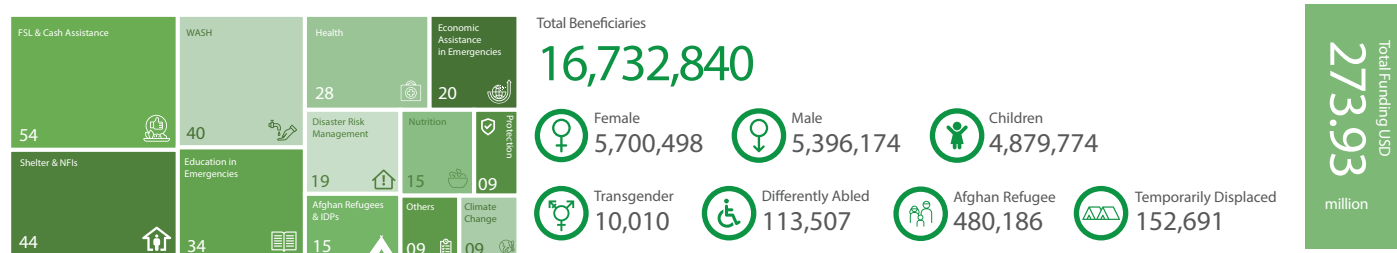
ANNUAL OVERVIEW

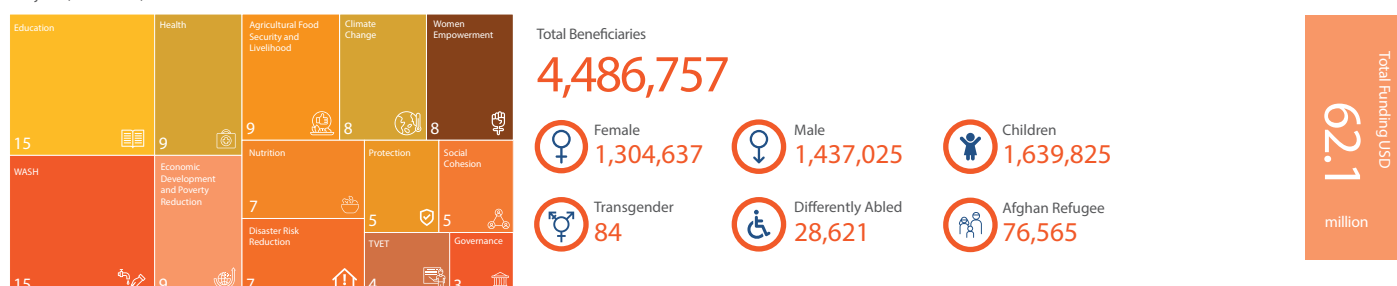
Projects (Sector Wise)
