Needs And Gaps



Health

- Immediate restoration of basic health services through mobile clinics in cut-off villages.
- Provision of essential medicines, including antibiotics, anti-malarials, and treatments for chronic conditions.
- Maternal and child health services, including antenatal and postnatal care, safe delivery kits, and access to emergency obstetric care.
- Disease outbreak prevention, through vaccination campaigns and improved surveillance of AWD, malaria, and dengue.
- Provision of ambulance/transport support for life-saving referrals.



Protection

- Establishment of safe spaces for women, girls, and children.
- Support for female-headed households with targeted assistance, livelihoods, and cash support.
- Distribution of legal and documentation services for households that lost ID papers in the floods.
- Greater inclusion of women in community leadership and decision-making.
- Strengthened child protection measures, including tracing for separated children and prevention of child labor and early marriage.



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

- Immediate access to safe drinking water through water trucking, chlorination, and repair and restoration of damaged wells and hand pumps.
- Construction of safe, gender-segregated sanitation facilities to reduce open defecation.
Distribution of hygiene kits, including soap and menstrual hygiene materials.
- Vector control interventions to mitigate malaria and dengue outbreaks, including spraying and drainage clearance.
- Safe management of waste to prevent the contamination of water sources, reduce the spread of water-borne diseases, and ensure a healthier environment for affected communities.
- Minor rehabilitation of WASH services at the health facility, including maintenance of water supply, hand washing facilities, toilets, laundry, septic pits, liquid waste management and solid and medical waste management facilities and provision of IPC and waste management kits.
- Community hygiene promotion campaigns and awareness raising to improve handwashing and safe personal and environmental hygiene practices.



MHPSS

- Establishment of child-friendly spaces to provide safe recreation, learning, and psychosocial care.
- Provision of group and individual counseling services for children and caregivers.
- Training of community focal points and teachers in basic psychosocial support and referral mechanisms.
- Integration of MHPSS support into health, education, and protection services.
- Development of stress management and vocational activities for youth to strengthen resilience



Nutrition

- Screening and treatment services for malnourished children, with referral to functional facilities.
- Targeted support for pregnant and lactating women, including supplementary feeding.
- Provision of nutritionally diverse food aid (pulses, oil, protein-rich foods) beyond cereals.
- Establishment of breastfeeding support services, with counseling and privacy in shelters.
- Monitoring and regulation of breast milk substitute distribution to prevent unsafe infant feeding practices and undermining breastfeeding practices. .



FSL

- Immediate food assistance, delivered through cash, vouchers, or in-kind rations tailored to household size.
- Livelihood recovery inputs, including seeds, tools, livestock, and cash-for-work opportunities.
- Market stabilization measures to ensure staple foods remain available and affordable.
- Targeted livelihood and food security support for female-headed households and daily wage earners, who are most at risk of hunger.
- Expansion of mobile cash transfer services to reach remote and vulnerable households.



Cross Cutting Edges

- Accessibility-focused programming to ensure women, girls, elderly persons and people with disabilities are not excluded.
- Gender-sensitive approaches across all interventions, with women actively participating in leadership and decision-making.
- Community engagement and accountability mechanisms, to ensure assistance is responsive to local needs and feedback.
- Infrastructure repair, especially roads and bridges, to restore safe humanitarian access.
