Engagement with Provincial Ombudsman Sindh and PDMA

PHF Country Coordinator, Mr. Syed Shahid Kazmi attended a meeting organized by the Provincial Ombudsman Sindh and the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA), aimed at engaging humanitarian partners. The primary objective of the meeting was to discuss the expansion and strengthening of the Ombudsman's office, particularly in relation to enhancing accountability mechanisms for affected populations during emergencies.

The discussion focused on ensuring that a robust and functional accountability system is in place, with active involvement from humanitarian actors.

Proposed Action Points:

Members who are interested in collaborating with the Provincial Ombudsman's office—particularly in areas such as community outreach, complaints management during emergencies, or strengthening aid accountability mechanisms—are encouraged to reach out to PHF. We can support and facilitate further engagement with the Sindh provincial authorities and help bridge potential partnerships in this regard.

Despite his tireless efforts, his earnings were barely sufficient to meet daily needs, especially as he bore the burden of his wife's prolonged medical treatment. Tragically, she succumbed to cancer, leaving him emotionally shattered and financially drained. Struggling to sustain his business and care for his children, Mr. Inayat faced the risk of losing his livelihood. Through its income generation initiative, Qatar Charity stepped in, providing vital support to revitalize his shop.






Amplify: Reimagining Performance at Alight

Amplify is Alight’s innovative performance management system—designed to move beyond traditional, top-down evaluations. It began with a bold question: How might we reimagine performance at Alight?

Through a co-creation journey with our employees and customers - including those in refugee camps, we developed a system rooted in growth, collaboration, and real-time feedback. Amplify was piloted with staff across the globe before being fully implemented.

Unlike conventional systems, Amplify focuses on continuous development. Employees and managers set goals together, supported by regular feedback from peers and relevant stakeholders - what we call the Alight Community. It’s not just a system - it’s a shared journey that empowers people to grow, adapt, and thrive.



Bringing Data to Life: The Role of the Action Plan Tracker

Monitoring data is one of the most valuable assets in program management, but all too often, it ends up underutilized. Many M&E and program teams struggle to translate findings into timely and effective action.

That’s where the Action Plan Tracker comes in.

This straightforward yet impactful tool has been gaining traction as a practical solution to bridge the gap between monitoring and decision-making. It helps teams organize follow-up actions, assign responsibilities, set deadlines, and most importantly track progress over time.

What makes the Action Plan Tracker particularly effective is how it creates space for MEAL and program staff to come together, reflect on findings, and agree on next steps. This kind of structured collaboration not only boosts accountability but also strengthens trust and teamwork across departments.

Why it’s working:

- Encourages timely, evidence-based decisions
- Turns recommendations into clear, trackable actions
- Promotes joint ownership between MEAL and program teams
- Fosters a culture of learning and continuous improvement

Whether following a routine monitoring visit, evaluation, or internal review, this tool ensures insights aren’t just documented they’re acted upon. It’s a simple innovation, but one that’s making a real difference in how teams respond, adapt, and improve.
